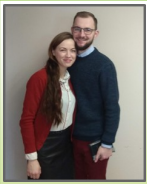

Matt Hill has been heading up the publishing work of Editorial Peregrino for the last 6 years. With more than forty years' experience and 300 titles on offer, Peregrino is highly respected for producing sound literature for the Spanish-speaking churches both in Spain and around the world.

As can be imagined, the COVID-19 situation has placed a tremendous strain on Peregrino's finances, with bookshops closed and Church bookstalls not operating. And at a time when online sales are most important, Peregrino is struggling with out-dated software operating its website. Obviously, they are looking to the Lord to sustain them, and they have done as much cost-cutting as they can including partially furloughing their staff. Please do pray for Peregrino and for their staff. But if you are able to make any financial contribution it would be greatly appreciated. It is hard to know exactly what's needed, but Matt estimates their needs to be in the region of £12,000, to meet present commitments, pay workers what they are owed, and replace the current website.

This month we focus on the work of **Antonis & Viki Topaloglou** who recently joined the EMF missionary family. They work in Thessaloniki, Greece, a country where most people consider that there is only one church – the Orthodox church – and evangelicals are regarded with suspicion. So they follow the apostle Paul's example of becoming all things to all people in order to reach people

with the gospel. They have set up a small community café in

the centre of Thessaloniki to provide a meeting place, running seminars etc. to share the gospel. Please pray particularly:

- For them to be available to be used by God, with strength to serve the community
- For the provision of a building for future church needs
- For the right co-workers to join the work
- For their family life as they bring up their 4 children.

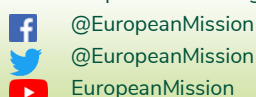
