# DISTRICT TREASURER



COVID has caused difficulties for everyone, but E3 North Coast's work has gone well. Andrew, our E3 worker, although partially furloughed during the year, has worked very effectively (with intern, Hannah Wilson, in the Spring) providing online material for primary, post-primary and special schools and taking outdoor opportunities when available. COVID has affected our finances - none of our normal fund-raising events (the coffee morning, quizzes and concerts) took place, although visits to churches were fruitful. Support through the furlough scheme and growth in giving from churches helped, but more finance is needed.

Prayer support remains strong: monthly prayer videos are sent out and (online) prayer meetings for supporters have been reintroduced. Andrew is guided by a committed local District Support Team. Thanks are due to Mike Dickie, who stood down as its Chairman last August for all his work, and to Mark Moorhead for stepping in temporarily this year. We are currently in the process of renewing the District Support Team for the years ahead.



## DISTRICT FINANCES

The E3 schools project on the North Coast is usually funded entirely by the ongoing generosity of individuals and churches in the area. However this year's figures also include 'income' from HMRC's Job Retention Scheme. Therefore the total income for the financial year April 2020-March 2021 was £28.824.

Our Expenditure was £25,517 leaving us with a surplus of £3307 for the year. This is encouraging in the current climate. It should be noted that without HMRC's Job Retention Scheme we would have concluded the year in deficit. We need to continue to seek new supporters for the Project to ensure its longevity - there are many ways to give and no amount is too small. This year has looked a little different to say the least. Instead of being in schools daily, we faced periods where schools were closed and, when they opened again, visitations were limited. Working hard, SUNI began to develop pre-recorded online Assemblies, SU Group material and RE Lessons. I loved working as part of a group to develop Christmas and Easter Lessons and we were thrilled to see how well received these were in schools.



We also embraced the outdoor life, delivering assemblies and RE Lessons in carparks and playgrounds. With schools opening up again in Term 3, we were delighted to continue our visits (especially having the opportunity to deliver It's Your Move lessons with P7 classes). It has been a real encouragement to develop new links with schools during this time and look forward to building on them in the future.

### FUIIPPING

The E3 Schools Project aims to equip pupils and teachers to be salt and light in their school. Doing that this year has been very challenging as our usual chances to work with pupils and teachers has been seriously limited.



However, we were pleased to be able to bring our pupil leadership programme Making Your Mark online this year as a way of supporting SU leaders, many of whom met with their groups virtually this year.

It has also been brilliant to have an intern with E3 North Coast for half of the year! Hannah Wilson joined us in the Spring and it has been wonderful to see her invest herself in the preparing and delivery of programmes for pupils in the North Coast.

IN 2020 - 2021 WE...

Physically visited schools 40 times, completed 4 series of RE lessons for national distribution, produced 112 online assemblies for PS, PPS and SEN, disseminated material to 318 schools, 78 of which were 'new' contacts.
